




## **Hospital Report**

By Illustrious Sir Don Thomson, P. P., Khartum Hospital Chairman

reetings, noble and ladies. In 2014, I have been busy on your behalf arranging transportation to, and accommodations for our children at our various Shriners Hospitals for Children. I also arranged for some of our child patients to be honorary ringmasters at the circuses, and to be available for interviews during the Odyssey fez car tour through Khartum's jurisdiction.

As of June 30, Khartum Shriners have sponsored 121 child visits this year at a cost of about \$108,000. Our present child visits are as follows:

Manitoba: 78 (66%) Northwest Ontario: 43 (34%)

> Twin Cities: 78 (64%) Canadian: 33 (28%) Chicago: 5 (4%)

Boston: 4 (3%)

Satellite Clinic in Winnipeg: 1 (1%)

Of the 121 patient visits, 8 are new children (Manitoba (6) and Northwest Ontario (2)) and 1 child required a medevac flight from the Canadian Hospital to Winnipeg at a cost of \$14,500. Even though Khartum Shriners still may have another child medevac flight at a cost of about \$14,500, we are on target for our 2014 budget of \$230,000.

In May, Assistant Rabban Jack Hildebrand and I witnessed the Odyssey Program kickoff, where a Fez car was unveiled to the public. Since then, that Fez car has traveled from the East Coast through the Maritimes, Northeastern USA, Quebec, and Ontario, and arrived in Khartum jurisdiction (Thunder Bay) on Tuesday, June 17. It left Brandon on Monday, June 24, heading west. While the Exceptional Care for Exceptional Kids Odyssey Fez Car tour has come and gone, I believe it was a huge success with Khartum Shriners from Thunder Bay through Dryden, Kenora, Winnipeg, and

Brandon on its way west. Wherever the Fez car went, the public were asking questions about it, our Hospitals for Children, and Shriners in general. Our Shrine kids and their families were willing to participate in any way they could, be it videotaping, photo ops, or telling

their story of how Khartum Shriners have helped them. We were fortunate that all Odyssey Shrine stops involved one or more current and/or past Shrine patients and families.

Chief Rabban Brian Terin was the chairman of the Odyssey program's tour through Khartum's jurisdiction. The program, with the help of nobles and ladies from Thunder Bay to Brandon, was quite successful. On behalf of our children, I thank all of you who helped in any way. Being there to meet and greet our patients or the Odyssey Tour staff is what made it successful. Follow the tour as it continues its journey at http://www.exceptionalcare4kids.com/en/odyssey.

As of May 31, donations and pledges for construction of the new Canadian hospital have reached \$115,782,948 of the

\$130,000,000 goal. I thank the Brandon & District Shrine Club and ladies and the Brandon Car Patrol for their generous donation to the Exceptional Care for Exceptional Kids campaign.

In April, members of the Board of Directors of Shriners Hospitals for Children met with the CEO of the Mayo Clinic. Currently, as Care Clinic "members," Shriners are "affiliates" which is a good first step and continued on page 9...

good for Shriners Hospitals, but now they would like to take it to the next level. The Chairman of the Board of Directors stated that "our desire is to become a partner with Mayo around the country in their Care Clinic network."

In May, Board members met with members of the University of Minnesota Medical School. They thought the only thing the University wanted to talk about was to buy the existing hospital building on River Road if Shriners ever moved to another location. Instead, the University was putt-

ing back on the table thoughts to resurrect the path to have Shriners move to their own new "outpatient" surgery center building, again across the street from the new Childrens Hospital. Five years ago, the Twin Cities hospital was working on a plan to have their hospital begin to occupy half the seventh floor of the University's new Childrens Hospital building being built on the campus. But due to a variety of small issues, it was mutually agreed to stop the plan.

What make Shriners Hospitals for Children (SHC) so important is the seemingly unlimited efforts of their staff to improve the lives of our children and families. Their staff continually hear parents express gratitude for giving hope

### Sphinx Temple No. 116 Daughters of the Nile

ongratulations, Sphinx Temple No.116 — you have once again come up with a banner year for the Shriner's Montreal Hospital Request giving. Our donation to the Directed Gifts and Grants program was \$2,100 (we bought a ZipZac chair for \$1,100 which will enable a child who is unable to walk or crawl to have mobility in his or her own home). One thousand dollars was sent to the Social Services department at the Montreal hospital to help patient families.

We donated 895 items to the hospital, including pre-op dolls, quilts, pillow cases, and bought items such as gift cards. The ladies volunteered 1,679 hours sewing, packing, and shipping these items. Our Campbell Soup bar codes came in at an impressive 10,000 (this is part of the Labels for Education program). As a result, at the end of their journey, the labels are turned into school supplies to be used at the Shriners hospitals. We thank all who played a part in making a difference for our Shrine patients and their families

It has certainly been a busy year so far for Sphinx Temple, Daughters of the Nile! We started the 101st year of Nile on March 23, 2014, with a beautiful installation of Queen Barb and her officers.

Queen Barbara's first official visit was to Royal Arch where she brought greetings from our temple and let them know just what Daughters of the Nile is all about. She was also invited to Grand Chapter to represent our temple where

she sat in honor in the East with our other concordant bodies' highest officers. She was invited to the Shrine Circus and the Grand Communications of Grand Lodge, to which she went directly from the airport on flying back from Omaha. That's dedication!

A Oueen's tribute dinner was held in Queen Barb's honor as a send-off to the 98th Supreme Session of the Supreme Temple, Daughters of the Nile. We had a great time in Omaha NE, where legislation was discussed and some passed, some didn't. One amendment that passed is that a former patient of Shrine Hospital can now join Daughters of the Nile. They see firsthand the work the ladies do for the patients, and they are so grateful that they also want to join in. Who better than a patient who has benefited personally from the hospital? From the care of the doctors and nurses, and the quilt they go home with, and everything in between? This is a huge step for Nile, and spreads awareness of what we do.

One subject that is brought up every year at Supreme is how well the Canadian temples did with their fundraising and donations to the hospital. This year was no exception! The ladies worked hard and donated more than \$400,000 to the CRF and the CEF. When you divide it between eleven temples here in Canada, where we make up only 9% of the entire Nile membership, this works out to \$40,000 per temple. That is **awesome!** This also enables us to have another million dollar plaque,

which puts us at \$4 million! We are the first hospital to reach that plateau. We were also the first for the \$3 million plaque, which subsequently was presented in 2009 by a Canadian supreme queen. This is what we are all about, helping our kids! The \$4 million dollar plaque will be presented at the opening of the new hospital in the fall of 2015, and an entire floor will be dedicated to the Daughters of the Nile!

Our Klassie Klowns were at it again, entertaining the kids at the Red River Ex the weekend of June 7?8. The weather was terrible but the Klowns persevered. Just can't keep a good Klown down!

Queen Barb did a wonderful job representing our temple in Omaha NE and continues to do so here in Winnipeg. Summer is here and we're awaiting the visit of our Supreme Queen Marcia Sowers on July 14. When we are back in the fall, there are a couple of fundraisers planned to continue our work of helping our kids. A fall fashion show is planned for September 20 and a Cinderella's closet is planned for October 25.

ince our last report, the Khartum Fife & Drum Band has been busy. Our Monday night practices have been well attended, and we have resurrected some old tunes.







Recruit and retain! We are all in this together for our Shrine kids — building for their future!







## Shriners Serve Pickerel to Huge Crowd

unday, June 1, 2014, saw twenty-six Winnipeg Shriners and their ladies arrive in La Riviere to help the Pembina Valley Shrine Club host the 17th annual Shriners Fish Fry at Blair Morrison Hall. This event raises funds to provide transportation services for sick kids from Manitoba and Northwestern Ontario to Shriners Hospitals for Children.

Pembina Valley Shriners, with the help of Khartum members and local volunteers, served a fabulous meal of fresh pickerel fillets fried in butter. There were also baked potatoes, home-baked beans, coleslaw, dinner rolls, ice cream, and beverages on offer. The crowd of about 620 people was eager and ready to stand in line for a great meal for a great cause — the Khartum Shriners Patient Transportation Fund. The all-you-can-eat pickerel meal kept volunteers busy, and those who came to enjoy the meal were not disappointed. They went home well fed and contented.

Potentate Rick Holberg was presented with a cheque for \$1,000 by Pembina Valley President Elwyn Brown. This will be topped up, probably in September, when expenses are paid and more fundraisers are completed. Last year, the local club contributed \$2,500 to the Khartum Shriners Patient Transportation Fund.

Potentate Rick was eager to share his thoughts and insights.

The Khartum Shriners Patient Transportation Fund provides free transportation for a child from newborn up to age eighteen and a family member to Shriners Hospitals in either Montreal, Boston, Chicago, or Minneapolis. Children with orthopaedic conditions, burns, spinal cord injuries, or cleft lip and palate are eligible for free transportation and care at twenty-two hospitals in Canada, the United States, and Mexico.

Our Shriners are willing to spend much of their personal time on Shrine affairs, such as this fish fry, often with little recognition of their efforts. But it is not recognition they are after — it is purpose for a cause. Pembina Valley Shriners are grateful for community support.

This unique health care system has now joined forces

with the Mayo Clinic to provide services in an efficient and compassionate family-centered environment. This will create a new research and treatment network that will transform children's lives while establishing new standards of care in the wider medical community.

Also new is a hospital being built in Montreal next to and aligned with McGill University Hospital to replace the existing unit. This facility should be ready for service in the fall of 2015.

Exceptional Care for Exceptional Kids is a campaign to raise funds to support this facility. The Exceptional Care Odyssey is touring the continent to visit patients and their families in fifty-five towns from coast to coast. The "Fezmobile," complete with Khartum's identifiable red fez, will raise awareness of the construction of the new Shriners Hospital for Children – Canada, and of the Shriners fraternity who have tirelessly supported the hospital since its founding in 1925. Of the \$130 million needed for this new facility, \$120 million has already been raised.

Noble Jim Graham and his Lady Paulette were also on hand to support this effort and were selling tickets on a 1967 Camaro 55, a car from Jim Gauthier's private collection valued at \$35,000. Three thousand tickets are being sold at \$40 each. With fewer than 500 tickets remaining, you can phone the Shrine office at 204-925-1430 or visit online at khartumshriners.org to get your ticket before they are all gone.

Pembina Valley Shriner Harry Brendle stated that since the barbecue was built seventeen years ago, Pembina Valley Shriners have proudly contributed more than \$40,000 to the Khartum Shriners Patient Transportation Fund, whose budget this year is \$230,000.

No man stands so tall as he who stoops to help a child. Let's all give our Shriners a pat on the back for a job well done.
