# Lhartum Hospital Report

As you know 2020 was not a great year for the Shriners Organization. With everything being cancelled or postponed globally due to the pandemic, it was a very disappointing experience to Khartum Shriners and the complete Masonic Organization. I apologize for not having a report in the last issue of the Kronicle, however, I was incredibly pleased that Illustrious Sir Denis and Lady Lindsey recognized and committed to the value of communication and reinstated the Kronicle once more.

With the advent of the pandemic in March 2020 Khartum Shrine patient visitations fell greatly. From January to the end of February we had provided for patients to attend 22 appointments including 1 new patient who went to the Canadian Hospital. During the months of March, April, May, and June we did not have any patients travelling due to appointments being cancelled or postponed based on Public Health Orders. In July we had some patients start to travel again; by year end Khartum provided the opportunity for a total of 41 patients (20 to Canadian, 20 to Twin Cities, 1 to Philadelphia) get to 70 appointments, included in this total were 12 new patients. In addition, we had 5 patients receive Telehealth Visits. Other than the telehealth visits, the patient appointments varied in length from 1-day to 2 weeks or longer.

Khartum's patient costs for 2020 were approximately \$80,000.00. And while our costs were down, so too were the donations. However, I would be remiss if I did not acknowledge and graciously thank the Khartum Ladies Auxil-

iary for your continued unwavering support and annual donation to the Patient Transportation Fund. Unfortunately, because of COVID<sub>2</sub> we were only able to provide 1 travel bag to a patient this year. I have discussed this with Lady Pat Allenby and advised her the patients that were missed will be provided bags on a subsequent visit when Public Health Orders permit me to see them off at the airport once again.

I should also add that thanks to the Khartum Shrine First Lady's Program "Big Wheels Keep on Turning". This program allowed Khartum Shriners to be able to replace a Khartum patient's wheelchair which had been was provided through the Canadian Hospital.

As we moved into 2021, we had one patient who spent Christmas in Montreal leaving Winnipeg on November 10, 2020 and returning home February 3, 2021. In addition to this patient during the first quarter of 2021 Khartum Shriners assisted 10 patients (8 Canadian 2 Twin Cities) travelling to 17 appointments and had 5 patients receive Telehealth visits. Our costs to the end of March are about \$15,000.00, a big thanks to the Air Canada Foundation for flight support. This year we have patients that are having longer stays due to procedures in hospital; 1 patient went to Montreal on January 16 and is expected to return end of April, 2 patients had 3 week stays, 2 patients had 2 week stays, while 1 patient has had 7 appointments in Twin Cities. I have had a couple of families cancel their appointments because of the quarantine require-

ments on returning home.

Khartum Shriners has again received West Jet Travel vouchers for use by the Canadian Temples for 2021, due to revised schedules and lack of available flights the Temples have not been able to utilize these yet. I had been using Aeroplan miles to help save some costs, but those have run out at present. Air Canada has provided some flight passes to Shriners Hospitals for Children Canada which I have been able to utilize, however these passes require us to pay some taxes and fees (just under \$3000.00).

In 2020 the New Shriners Children's Twin Cities was opened in Woodbury MN a suburb of Minneapolis. This facility is strictly an outpatient clinic; surgeries for our patients are conducted at Gillette Children's or other facilities including SHC Canada. Our patients and families who use this facility are incredibly pleased with the staff, location, and facility.

Dr Christopher S Vara MD Pediatric Orthopedic Surgeon at Shriners Children's Twin Cities has been recognized as one of Minnesota's 100 Most Influential Health Care Leaders. Dr Vara says that like any business, health care must balance quality and finances. Health care is extremely complicated for patients to navigate, including factors such gaining access to a provider, locating a specialty, coordinating care between providers, and understanding clinical and financial responsibilities. Our wraparound service provides patients access to orthopedic specialty providers, ancillary services, and care manage-

single location to remove barriers in the advancement of their care. We have taken further steps to simplify the patient experience via telehealth in our new outpatient location, which is available throughout our six-state service area. We provide high quality of care to children without regard to the ability of a patient or family to pay

Michelle Jones, child life specialist at Shriners Children's Twin Cities, has been chosen as one of Twin Cities Business Magazine's Notable Heroes in Health Care! They recognize medical professionals who serve on the front lines and behind the scenes, fighting COVID-19 and working to keep their patients as healthy as possible. Michelle received this honor because of the adaptations she made to her work when COVID-19 strictions did not allow her to see patients face-to-face. She created several video presentations to help families through the beginning of this pandemic.

In December 2020 Shriners Hospitals for Children — Canada proudly launched the French adaptation of Rinascerò, rinascerai, composed by Roby Facchinetti and written by Stefano D'Orazio, who sadly passed away from COVID-19. Singer Daniela Fiorentino, an Italian from Naples and a Montrealer by adoption, has adapted the song into French for Quebec audiences. In March 2020, the COVID-19 pandemic brought the whole world to its knees, especially in Italy. Roby and Stefano have graciously decided to donate all proceeds from the diffusion of Rinascerò, rinascerai to the Giovanni XXIII Hospital in Bergamo, a city severely hit by the pandemic. On

this side of the world, all the profits from the diffusion of the French adaptation will go to Shriners Hospitals for Children — Canada. Composed in tears but brought to life with strength and resilience during quaran-Rinascerò, tine. nascerai received over 15 million views in just a few days. Around the world, artists are translating the song into their own languages for the benefit of foundations in their respective countries. You can view the video by copying and pasting "Je renaîtrai, tu renaîtras", in your web browser. This song demonstrates a musical act of solidarity between Italy and Canada, a simple way to do some good in spite of COVID.

Dr Thierry E. Benaroch, Orthopedic Surgeon at Shriners Hospitals for Children - Canada, has been named as the Chief of Staff at Shriners Hospital for Children Canada. Dr Benaroch started at the Shriners Hospitals for Children – Canada in 1993, however he did his master's degree there starting in 1986. He says that thinking about everything the Shriners has brought me over the last 27 years, I only want one thing: to give back. This institution is simply extraordinary, and my wish is to continue sharing the legacy that the Shriners network established at the beginning of the 20th century. His clinical interests are cerebral palsy, foot disorders including club feet, and developmental dysplasia of the hip. Benaroch is also Division Director of Pediatric Orthopedics and Associate Professor of Surgery at McGill University.

Overall, the Canadian Hospital has returned to nearly 100% pre-

COVID capacity in the Ambulatory Clinic, Rehabilitation Department as well as the Operating Room all the while ensuring all sanitation requirements are met. An incredible total of 2060 visits occurred in the Ambulatory Care Clinic, a strong beginning of the year with numbers reaching impressive pre-COVID levels. I am happy to say that the Canadian Hospital remains COVID Free and as of the middle of March, 94% of hospital staff have been vaccinated.

Shriners Hospitals for Children – Canada wants to hear from our patients and families. They may receive a satisfaction survey in the days following their visit. Press Ganey an independent firm evaluate their experience with our hospital. They measure our performance to guarantee the accuracy of the results and ensure that the process is confidential. Press Ganey is a highly recognized firm within the health sector that has been working with hundreds of hospitals in North America for over 35 years. Founded by Drs. Press and Ganey, an anthropologist and statistician respectively, Press Ganey's mission is to assist health establishments to understand and improve the patient experience. All Shriners hospitals use their services.

The survey is sent out every time a patient visits the hospital (except if they've had several appointments within a short period of time). They receive the questionnaire by mail (with a self-addressed envelope), by email or by text. The electronic version will come from survey@pressganeysurveys.com and contains a link to the survey. If received by email, they can use a computer, tablet or smartphone to complete it. The way the surveys are sent

out is ran- Cont'd on pg 13 ...

dom so the hospital can't tell whether they'll receive a paper or electronic version.

The feedback regarding the outpatient or rehab experience, surgery or hospitalization is important, the survey will allow families to rate several aspects of their hospital visit. As examples; were you satisfied with the way you booked an appointment? Was the staff courteous? Did you feel safe in the hospital? Did you feel that there was teamwork among the clinicians? Did you feel ready to leave when you were discharged from the hospital?

Survey results are usually very positive and many of you say that they'd recommend our hospital to someone else. In the last four years, our hospitalization unit won the Press Ganey award for outstanding organizations. However, the results also show that there's room for improvement in some sectors and departments. Their feedback helps to improve our services and staff listen to what they have to say.

Patients can be rest assured their feedback – good or bad – will in no way affect the quality of the services they receive at the Shriners Hospitals for Children – Canada.

In closing I recently received a card from a patient's family which I would like to share. This patient underwent a series of bone lengthening procedures. "We wanted to thank you for everything you did to support our son during this process. We wouldn't have done this without the support from Shriners. We had a few firsts this week our son could see himself in the bathroom mirror, and he could reach his bedroom light switch. These are things that we will never take for granted LIFE AL-TERING. Thanks for everything you do to make this possible, we are forever grateful to the Shriners."

I also received an email from another patient's family which read "Want to let you know we came home Friday the trip except for the 7 hour delay in Toronto was perfect our accommodation and everything. The surgery was well beyond what we thought possible we are extremely grateful to all, from you to the surgeons, nurses, social services, and everybody in between. Thanks again for everything".

These thank yous are a culmination of the work you have all provided. While I may have the privilege of being the face of Khartum Shriners to our patient families -it is your efforts, your devotion, and your care that provides for these families. The difference you make is real; the lives you change is real; and the legacy of love, time, energy, hours, finances and care make a difference in the life of each and every child we help.

Nobles and Ladies thank you for your support and everything you do and have done for the Shrine and our Shrine Patients. You have put smiles on our children's faces and given them the greatest gift of all – HOPE FOR THE FUTURE.

# Notentate's Lady

I'm continuing to host monthly virtual get togethers where the ladies will chat, catch up, play bingo, play trivia, etc! It's been great having a casual, fun evening so far. See you on Zoom!

This year, my First Lady's Project is iPADs to facilitate a research project at Shriners Hospitals for Children - Canada in the field of Arthrogryposis multiplex congenita (AMC) and build a database. AMC is clinically defined as congenital joint contractures in two or more areas of the body; meaning affected joints become permanently fixed in a flexed or extended position. This rare condition can completely or partially restrict joint movement, impacting the joint function and range of motion. .

This research project, lead by the research team at Canada Shriners Hospital, will gather data from over 300 families, and a functional assessment providing current information on the child's mobility, contractures, joints, level of autonomy in their daily life, pain level and quality of life. Paired with their history of medical procedures, this information will give a better understanding of the child's medical and clinical needs. The ultimate goal of this database is to map out the relationships between the physical traits—or phenotype —and the genotype. As the only Canadian Hospital with a multidisciplinary AMC Clinic, AMC patients seek their expertise.

One of the main fundraisers for this Project will be a virtual Walk for Love from May 21 -- 31. Please see https:// donate.lovetotherescue.org/ khartumshrineladies to donate or join a team.
