Lhartum Hospital Report

At the end of the first quarter of 2022, your patient transportation has provided for 19 patients to attend 23 patient visits, the majority went to Shriners Hospitals for Children Canada. One patient who went in February will be long term in Montreal for 2-3 months with 2 or 3 appointments per week (only counted as 2 visits). In addition, we had 3 patients who received a telehealth visit. Khartum's Transportation costs for the first quarter are about \$40,800. Some of these costs are a carry over from November and December invoices from SHC Canada received in late January and February. Due to weather related flight delays we recently incurred 1-day extra costs (taxi fares, meals and accommodations) for 2 patients. As well I reimbursed 1 family for luggage (\$63.00) that was supposed to be included in with their ticket. In the past I have had families' park at the Shrine Center and transported them to the airport and back, however with the gas stealing issues occurring in Winnipeg and our lot being unsecured, I no longer recommend our patients park overnight at the Shrine Center.

At the end of the first quarter of 2022 Shriners Hospital for Children Canada have received 5885 Patient encounters including 1566 new referrals, 331 Outpatient Encounters, 136 Telehealth encounters and 295 surgeries not including the 77 surgeries that were cancelled. In addition there were 36 surgeries conducted offsite.

To optimize holistic patient care, our interdisciplinary team has been working on optimizing the pre-operative process. The streamlined approach is providing efficient, supporting and medically complete care to our patients who are undergoing surgery.

At Shriners Hospitals for Children Canada the Nursing Research Team have shown the incredible impact of using virtual reality to distract children during painful procedures. They are now recruiting patients for additional studies aimed at transforming this project from research into clinical practice by integrating virtual reality in the continuum. Currently, healthcare professionals around the hospital, including social workers and pain specialists are calling upon nursing research to help their patients cope with pain or anxiety before and during a procedure. The next step is to make this accessible and establish the process, provide the tools and clinical guidelines for use by the care team.

Shriner's Hospitals for Children is rebranding the name to Shriner's Children's (Location). Shriners Hospitals for Children - Canada will conserve its current name (a registered trademark) and it has been confirmed that the current logo will remain in both French & English. This is the Canadian hospital's legal name and cannot change as it meets legal requirements in Quebec. The new "Shriners Children's" is used in the US, and as the overall umbrella branding. For Canada and Mexico, as seen on the website. which is Shriners Children's overall, we are still identified with Shriners Hospitals for Children - (Canada) (Mexico) in their section and elsewhere in the text. The hospital, Temples, and other organizations that work with SHC Canada should continue to use the existing logos.

For anyone who is interested in joining the 4 Quarterly TEAMS meetings with Hospital Leadership, these meetings are open to all Shrine Members, Clubs, Units and Ladies Organizations. The information/link to join each meeting will be sent out to those on the Khartum's email list. The last conference call was held on March 23, however the 3 remaining conference calls are scheduled for June 8 (1 PM Eastern Time), September 28 (2 PM Eastern Time) and December 7 (2 PM Eastern Time).

Congratulations to the Daughters of the Nile Canadian Foundation, they will be recognized on May 20 with a plaque for their \$6 Million cumulative donation to the Canadian hospital. Because of the COVID protocols in place and the limited numbers for attendance this event will be a hybrid presentation (in person and virtual) via teams.

The Annual Shriners Hospitals for Children-Canada Invitational Golf tournament will be held at the Summerlea Golf and Country Club on Monday, August 8, 2022. This will be followed by the Annual Hospital Seminar which will be a hybrid in-person and virtual format on Tuesday, August 9th and Wednesday, 10th, 2022. Depending on Covid rules in place in the hospital at that time the in-person face to face space and or numbers may be limited.

Based on the first quarter experienced in the Twin Cities market, they have stated to **Cont'd on pg 5...**

gain traction in how their ambulatory care clinic model is expected to operate. They have been in deep discussions with other organizations to identify how they can further collaborate in their markets to serve more children and spread their presence to align with Vision 2035. This includes getting back to their outreach locations on a more regular schedule, partnering with new organizations across the market and deepening relationships with existing organizations.

Operationally, they still face challenges burdened by outdated bylaws that need to change if they want to remain relevant and true to the Shrine mission of serving all children with the best care anywhere regardless of means to pay. This includes those children who have the financial means either independently or covered by insur-

ance who want to come to Shriners Children's. Unfortunately, the stigma of Shriners only serve "free kids" is still alive and we either have children not coming here because we are not in network with their payer or are those with financial means to pay as a self-pay but do not like to be identified "charitable" and get free care. The beauty of our system is that we can serve all who can and want to pay or cannot pay. This is the differentiator that addresses healthcare dispari-

Clinically, Shriners Children's have started to add services back that had dwindled during the past several years due to market dynamics and the transition we made to an ambulatory care clinic. Some of these services are cranial facial services that will initially address plagiocephaly and in the future provide surgi-

cal care for cleft lip and pallet. As well they are updating their ultrasound so they can do needle guided steroidal injections and they have received final approval to install our sensory space therapy equipment. Lastly, by the end of April Shriners Children's Twin Cities hope to expand services for direct community referrals to therapy (this is huge).

Nobles and ladies thank you for everything you do to give each child in our care a better quality of life. However please remember, we do not provide "free care". We offer "the best care anywhere!!!" regardless of the patient's or family's ability to pay.


Overall, it was great to meet up with Shriners across North America and the world and help celebrate fun and fellowship.


Noble Bert truly was a dedicated Shriner and Patrol member.

This is completely different needed coverage separate from the Khartum liability policy which will only protect Khartum and its operations.

This discovery brought into question the very existence of the unit in the future.

After an extensive search for a policy with many, many, many denials, the unit was able to finally secure a 3rd party personal liability policy to protect all members of the Drifters for parading and practicing activities with respect to these novelty vehicles. This policy ALSO allows all novelty vehicles to have coverage (not just Drift Trikes), so if any Noble has a novelty vehicle and wants to parade, please consider joining the Drifters to benefit from this protection – feel free to contact Noble Greg Ward for more information greg ward3@hotmail.com. We are really looking forward to once again parading safely this summer!
